

Inspire, Connect and Make A Difference

MAD exists to make a difference in the lives of disadvantaged children and young people by funding equipment and services they would otherwise be unable to afford. The equipment we fund has an immediate impact on the day-to-day life and wellbeing of the beneficiary and their family or carer.

MAD is run entirely by volunteers so administration expenses are kept low at around 1% of revenue to maximise the funding that is available for beneficiaries. Over the 19 year journey, MAD has supported hundreds of beneficiaries directly by funding over \$1.5m of equipment and services.





Donations Paid (Cumulative)


